How to write a Bibliography

Many students come in to our library to do research. One of the most common things you ask us is "My teacher says I have to do a bibliography. How do I do that?" Well, here's our tips about bibliographies - what they are and how to make them.

What is a bibliography (bib-li-og-ra-phy)? A bibliography is a list of the books of a specific author or publisher, or on a specific subject. Why do I need to make a bibliography? A bibliography helps you know where you got your information from and it lets your teacher know you are giving proper credit for your sources of information. What do I include in a bibliography? You should list every source you use such as a book, a movie, a website, an interview or any information that did not come from you. Where do I put the bibliography for my assignment? The bibliography goes at the end of your assignment. The title of this page should be Bibliography or Works Cited

How to Make a Bibliography

- Alphabetize by author's last name.
- . If no author, go by the first main word of the title.
- Book with one author: Bladgett, E.D. <u>Alice Munro.</u> Boston: Twayne, 1988.
- Book with more than one author: Elwood, Ann, and Linda C. Wood. <u>Windows in Space</u>. New York: Walker, 1982.
- 3. Article in a magazine:
 Daglish, Brenda, "A Matter of Interest." Maclean's, February 15, 1993, pp.36-37.
- Article in a newspaper:
 Smith, Beverly, "Canadians Skate to Gold Medal," <u>The Globe and Mail.</u>
 March 11, 1993. p. A1.
- Article in an encyclopedia: Humber, William. "Bicycling." The Canadian Encyclopedia, 1988.
- 6. Video or Film:
